Deutsche Bank Award winners announced at the London Contemporary Dance School

The winners of the annual Deutsche Bank Awards were announced last night at a ceremony at the London Contemporary Dance School.

Awards are presented in thirteen categories and recognise artistic innovation, talent and creativity, but also, critically, entrepreneurship.

Among the winners during the evening were:

- **Tom Pope** - who received the Award in Art with the Royal College of Art for his 'Destroy Your Clocks' piece, a pilgrimage for 40 days and 40 nights, where he will take a long case grandfather clock from London to Geneva;
- **Rachel Fox** - whose Boom! Circus Theatre received the Award in Circus with Circus Space. The group is a collective of six innovative and vibrant young performers who twist, balance and create rhythm on and around cube structures and each other;
- **Patrick Gleeson** - who received the Award in Dramatic Arts with LAMDA for his Electric Animal Circus, which is going to develop and produce a show based around custom-built animatronic mechanical animals. They perform extraordinary circus acts in a futuristic, post apocalyptic variety show.

The prize for the winners includes a £10,000 investment in their business, a business mentor from Deutsche Bank and a place on a small business training course. In addition, winners gain access to Deutsche Bank's mentor networks and opportunities to attend performances and exhibitions of interest.

Deutsche Bank Award in Contemporary Dance with the London Contemporary Dance School

Laura's Collective Bern Retour is to establish a platform for young contemporary dancers and choreographers from Bern. The collective will provide future choreographers the

opportunity to create their primary work with the chance to receive constructive feedback and encouragement. The main event is the yearly performance Bern Retour in August.
